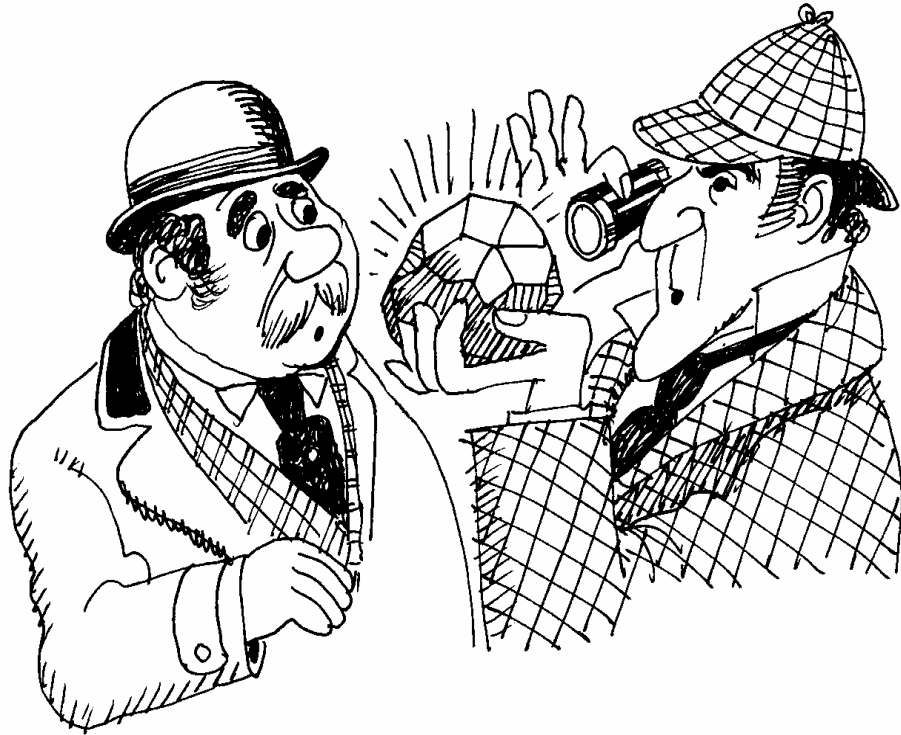


OPAQUE

(oh PAYK) *adj.*

impervious to light; dull; hard to understand; unclear

Link: **FAKE**

(ah STEN seh bul) *adj.*

as genuine or real

not the **SENSIBLE** thing to do.”*

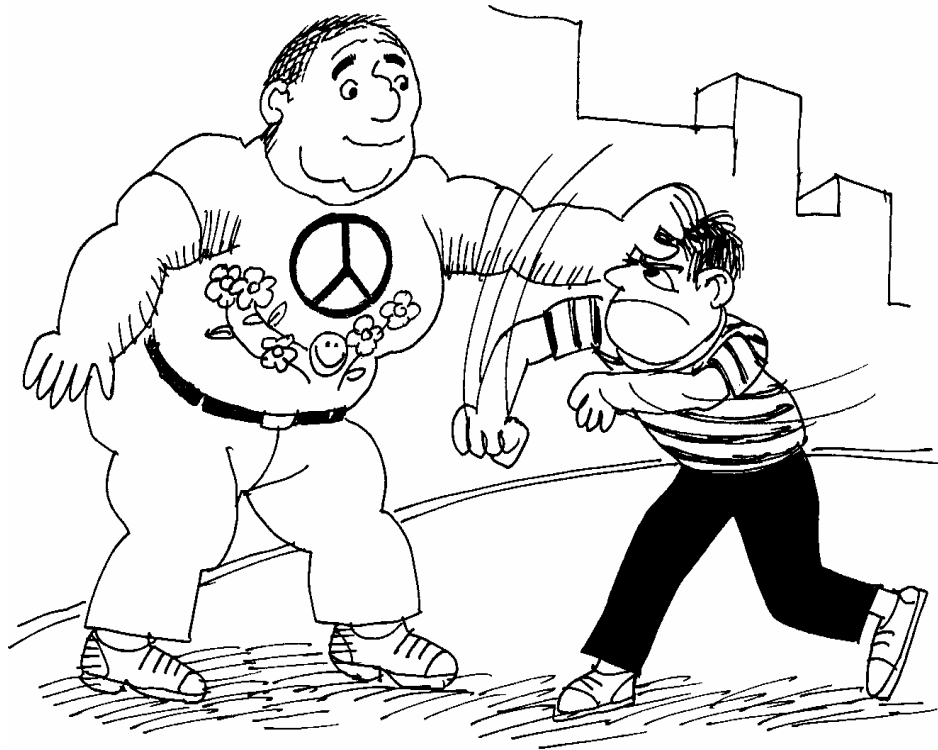

PACIFIST

(PAS ih fist) *n.*

one who is in opposition of war or violence

*“A **PACIFIST** never uses his **FIST**.”*

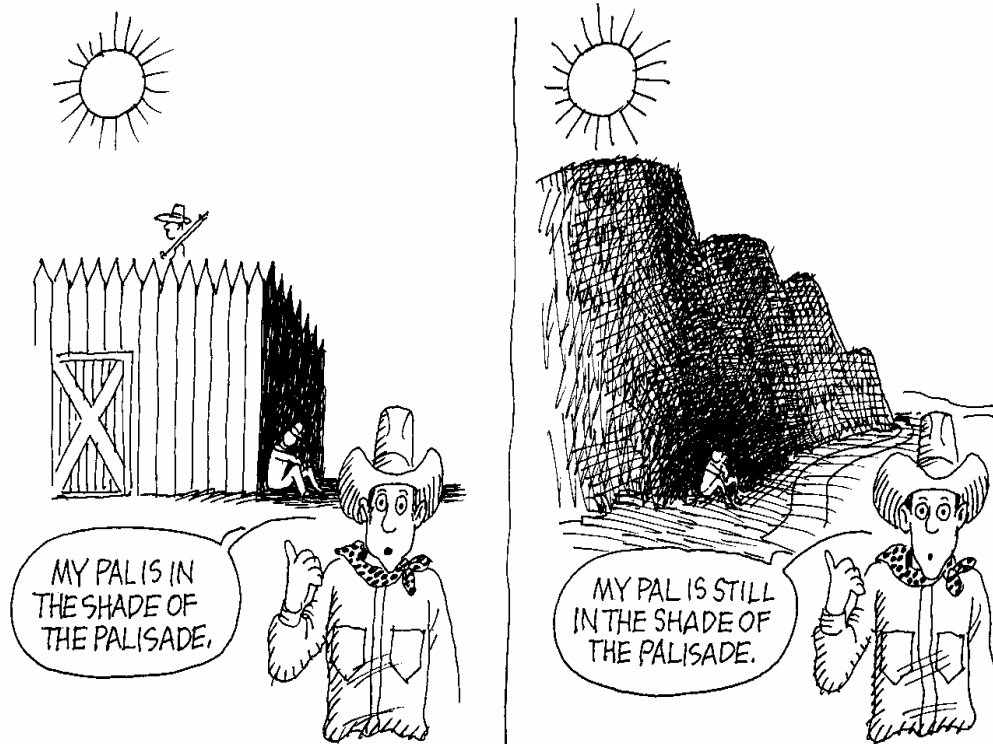

PALISADE

(pal ih SAYD) *n.*

a fortification of timbers set in the ground; an extended cliff

PALLIATE

(PAL ee ayt) v.

to make seem less serious; to mitigate

Link: **PAL HE ATE**

PALPABLE

(PAL pah bul) *adj.*

capable of being touched or felt

(pa NASH) *n.*

dashing elegance of manner or style

(pan DEM ik) *adj.*
widespread; general

“PANDAS are PANDEMIC to China.”

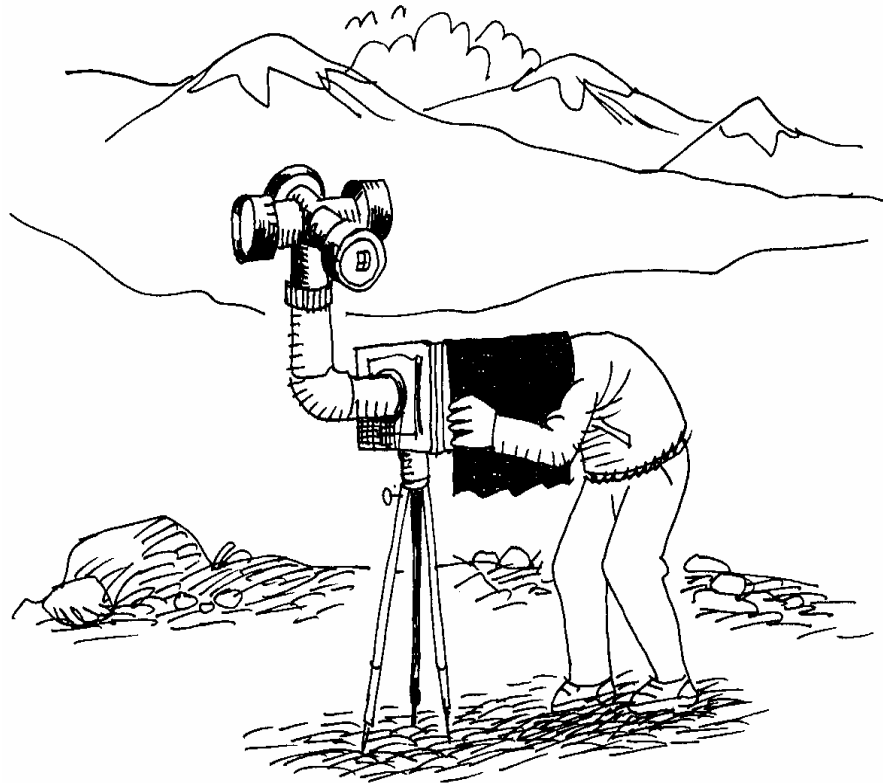

an unbroken view of a wide area
