OPAQUE

(oh PAYK) *adj.* impervious to light; dull; hard to understand; unclear

Link: FAKE



"This "diamond" is **OPAQUE**; it must be **FAKE**."

OSTENSIBLE

(ah STEN seh bul) *adj.* appearing as such; offered as genuine or real

PACIFIST

(PAS ih fist) *n.* one who is in opposition of war or violence



(pa NASH) *n.* dashing elegance of manner or style

PANDEMIC

(pan DEM ik) *adj.* widespread; general


