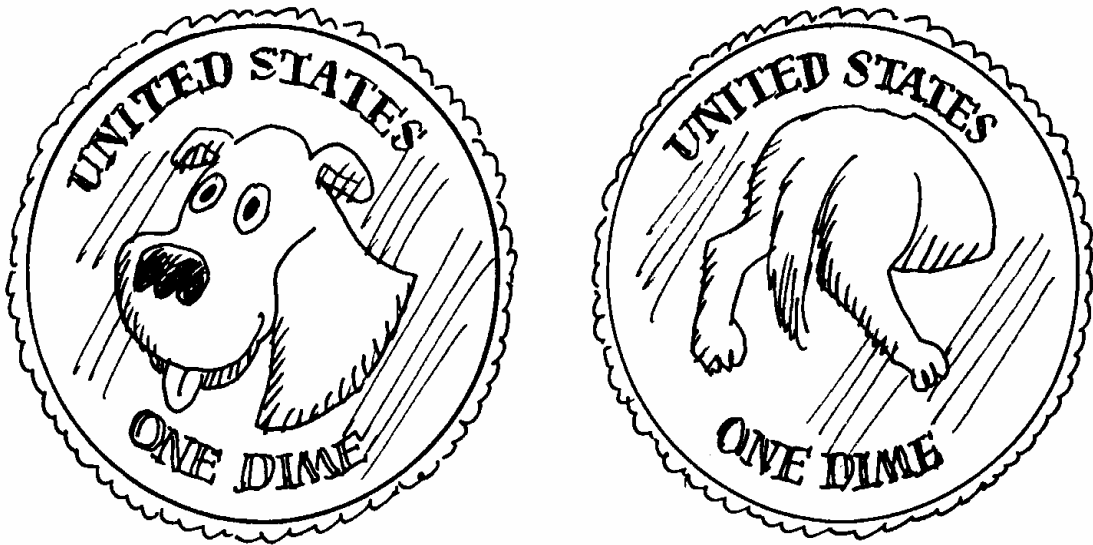


PARADIGM

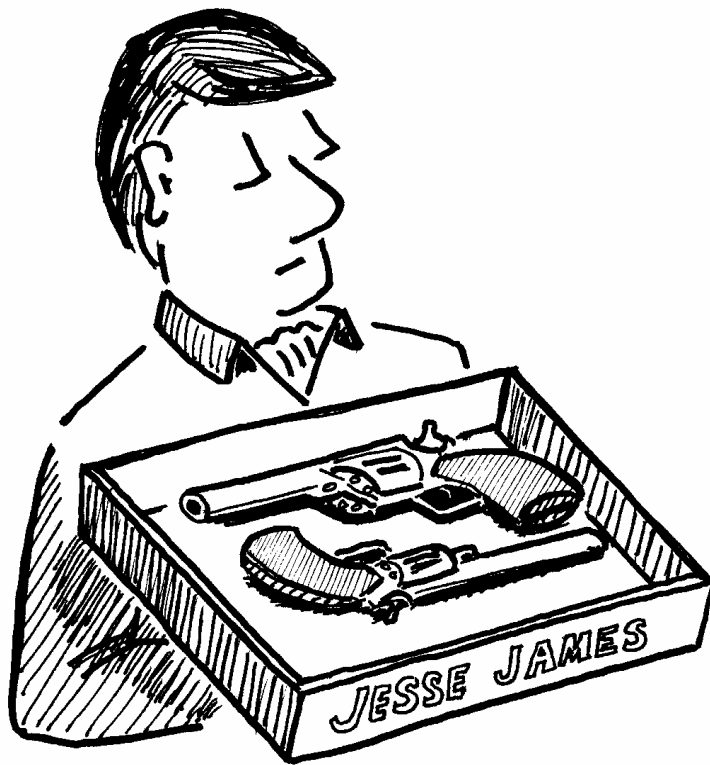

PARAGON

(PAIR ah gone) *n.*

a model or pattern of excellence

“A PARAGON PAIR OF GUNS”

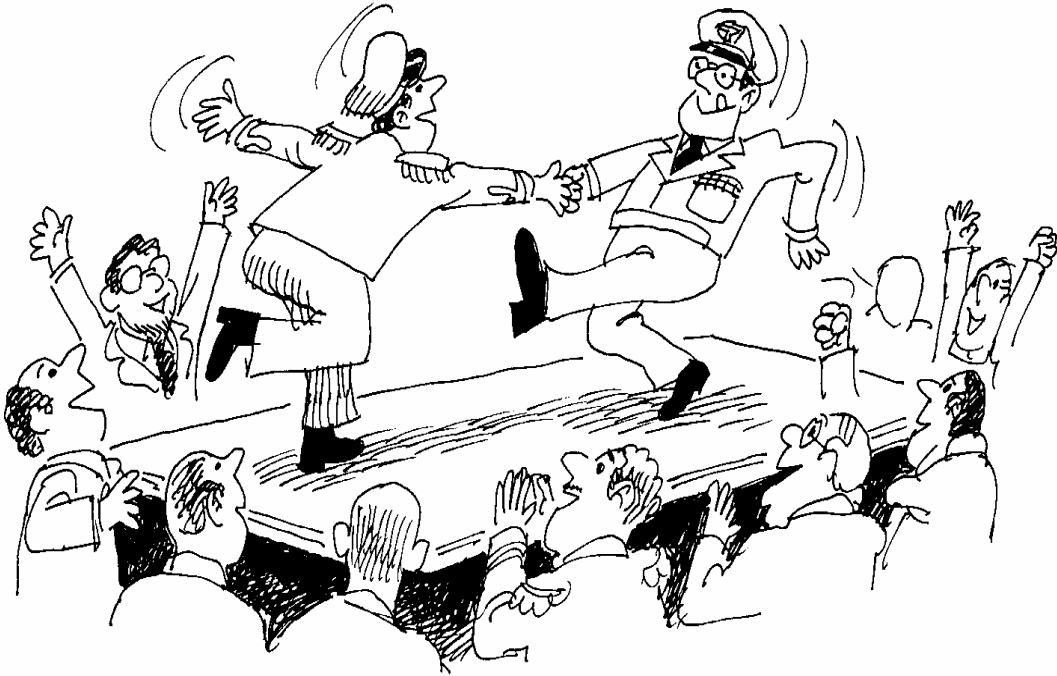

- ❑ Although Joyce was a **PARAGON** of virtue, she was also good fun to be with at the same time.
 - ❑ While not an architectural **PARAGON** to be copied, the sturdy old brick house has withstood many hurricanes.
 - ❑ William named his shoe company **PARAGON** Shoes, with expectations customers would think his shoes the best.

PARLEY

(PAHR lee) *n.*

a conference, especially between enemies

- ❑ A **PARLEY** was scheduled between the leaders of the opposing nations.
 - ❑ The National Football League owners and players **PARLEYED** to reach a settlement of salary caps.
 - ❑ After a brief **PARLEY**, the defense attorney and prosecuting attorney agreed to settle the dispute out of court.

PATRIARCH

(PAY tree ahrk) *n.*

the leader of a family or tribe

*“The **PATRIARCH’S** specialty is **PASTRY ART.**”*

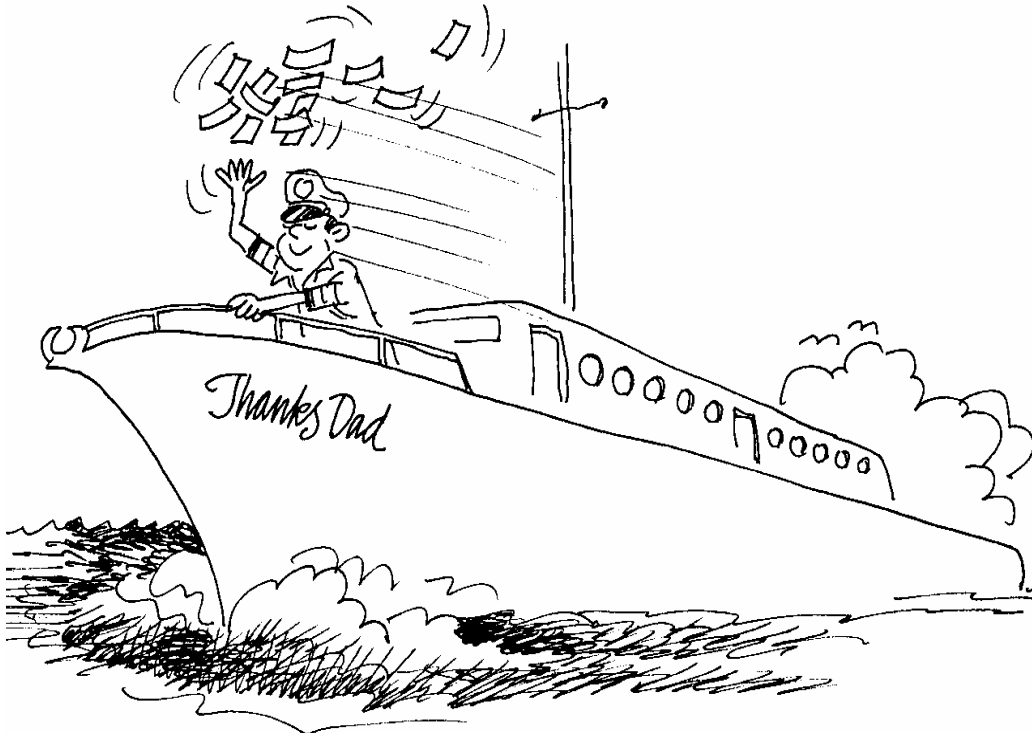

 - ❑ William Bradford led the pilgrims to the new world and acted as **PATRIARCH** of the colony.

PATRIMONY

(PA trih moh nee) *n.*

an inheritance from a father or an ancestor; anything inherited

Link: **PAT'S MONEY**



"PAT'S MONEY is his PATRIMONY."

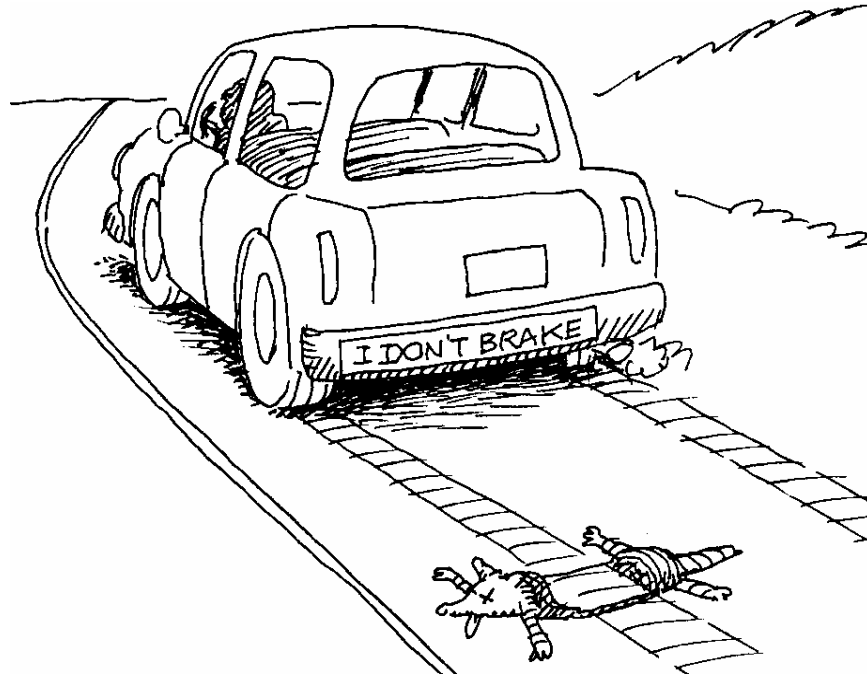

 - ❑ Ill-will in the family was a result of arguing over the **PATRIMONY**.
 - ❑ Jonathan squandered his **PATRIMONY** and died penniless.

PECCADILLO

(pek ah DIL oh) *n.*

a slight or trifling sin; a minor offense

Link: **ARMADILLO**



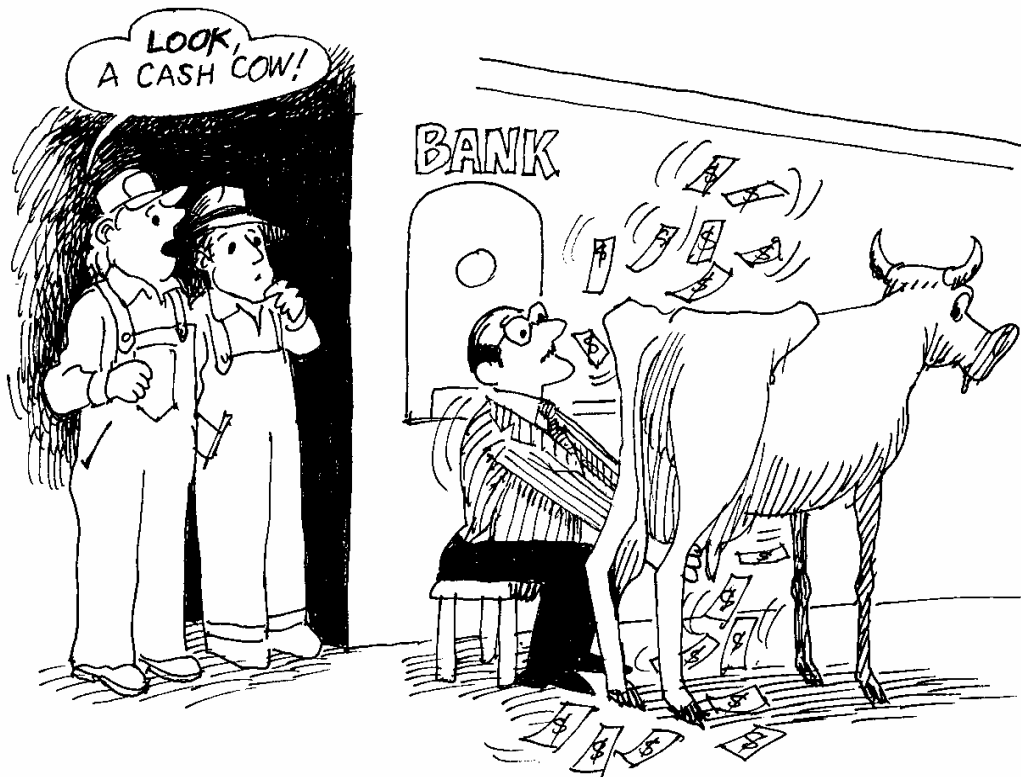
*“Norm thought running over an

- ❑ The reporters were more interested in the president’s personal **PECCADILLOES** than the state of the economy.
 - ❑ Being ticketed for running a red light is a mere **PECCADILLO** compared to driving while intoxicated.
 - ❑ Bob couldn’t believe he could be punished for the **PECCADILLO** of not cleaning his room at boarding school.

PECUNIARY

(pi KYOO nee er ee) *adj.*
consisting of or relating to money

- ❑ Alex's concerns about college were specifically **PECUNIARY**.
 - ❑ Ryan wanted to take Jessie to the prom but didn't ask her because of his **PECUNIARY** problems.

PEDESTRIAN

(peh DES tree ahn) *adj.*
ordinary; moving on foot

Link: **PEDESTRIAN**



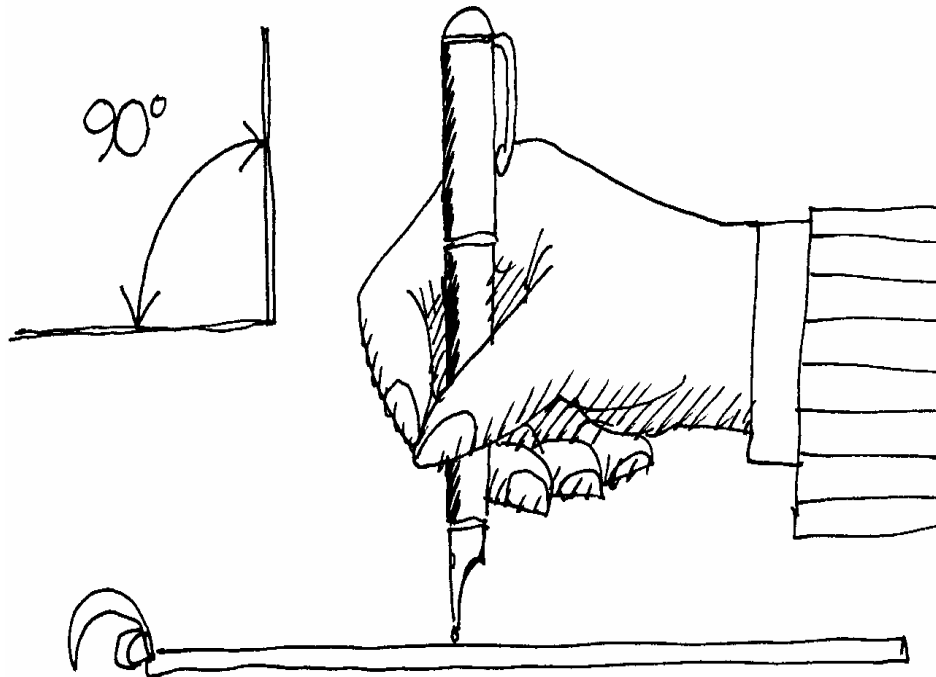
“PEDESTRIAN PEDESTRIANS”

- ❑ The **PEDESTRIAN** crosswalk is marked by white lines running across the street.
 - ❑ For once, can't we do something that isn't so boringly **PEDESTRIAN**?

PERPENDICULAR

(pur pen DIK yu ler) *adj.*
upright or vertical; being at right
angles to the plane of the horizon

Link: **PEN**



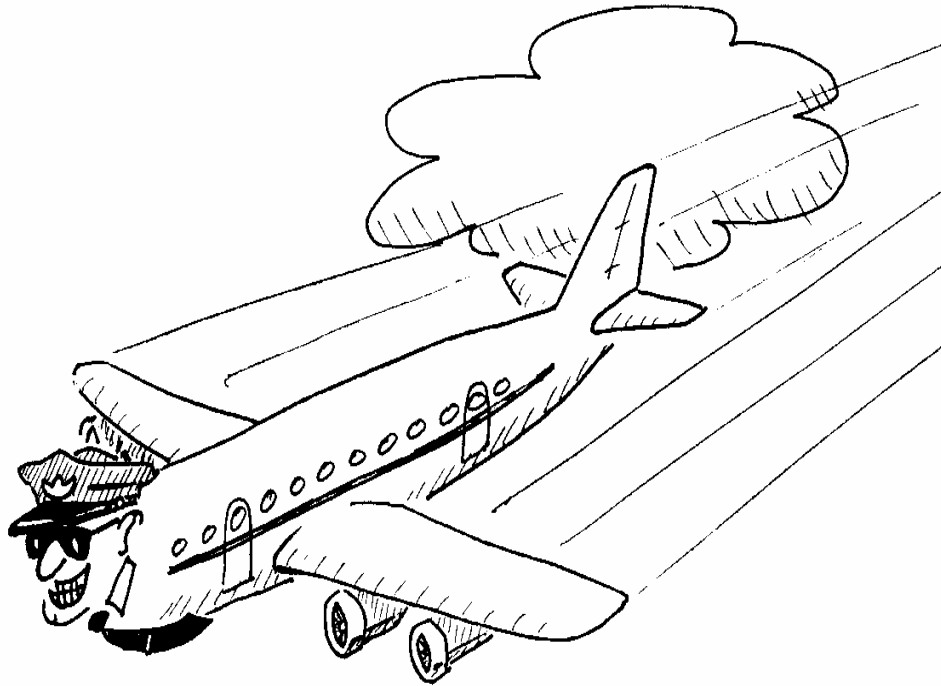
*“The **PEN** is **PERPENDICULAR**

- The pole is **PERPENDICULAR** to the ground.
 - The tall mast of the sailing ship was built **PERPENDICULARLY** to the deck.

PERSONIFY

(per SAWN ih fye) v.
to think of or represent as having
human qualities; to typify

Link: **PERSON FLY**



*“Captain Minerich is a **PERSON** who
PERSONIFIES FLYING.”*

- Their child **PERSONIFIES** every thing that is good about each of them.
 - In her poem she attempts to **PERSONIFY** death.
 - Benjamin Franklin **PERSONIFIES** all the attributes of the Revolutionary period.
