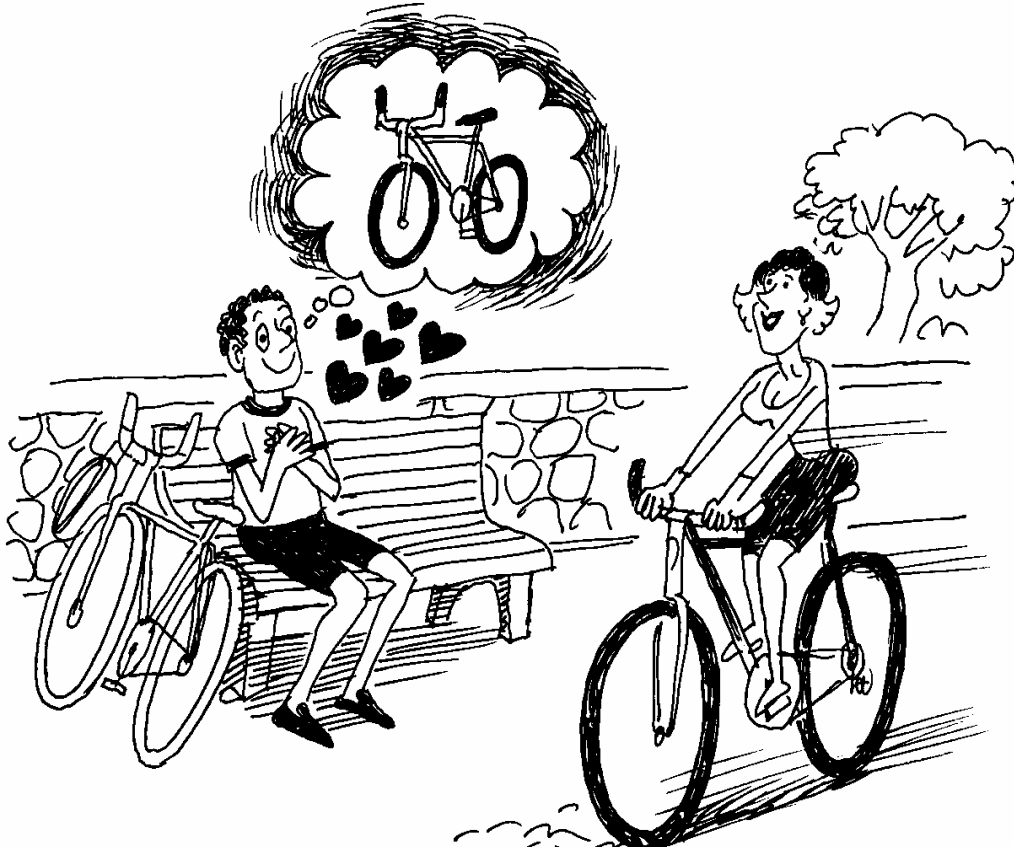

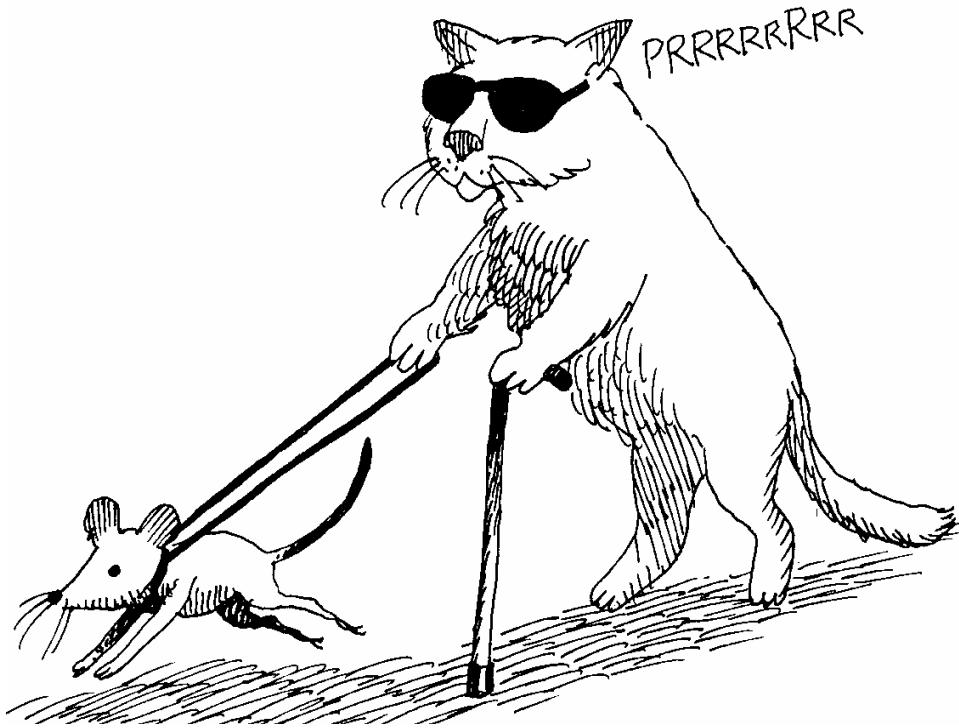

Link: **PURR BLIND**



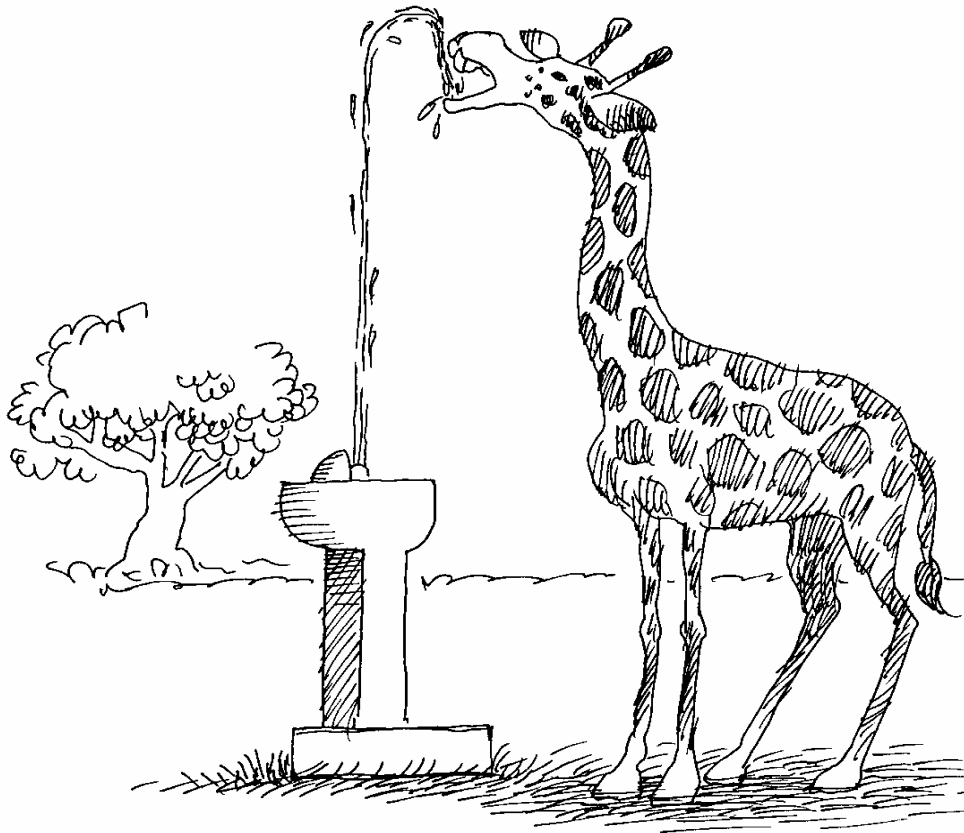
*“The **PURBLIND** cat **PURRED** as it was led by its seeing-eye mouse.”*

“A QUAFFING GIRAFFE”

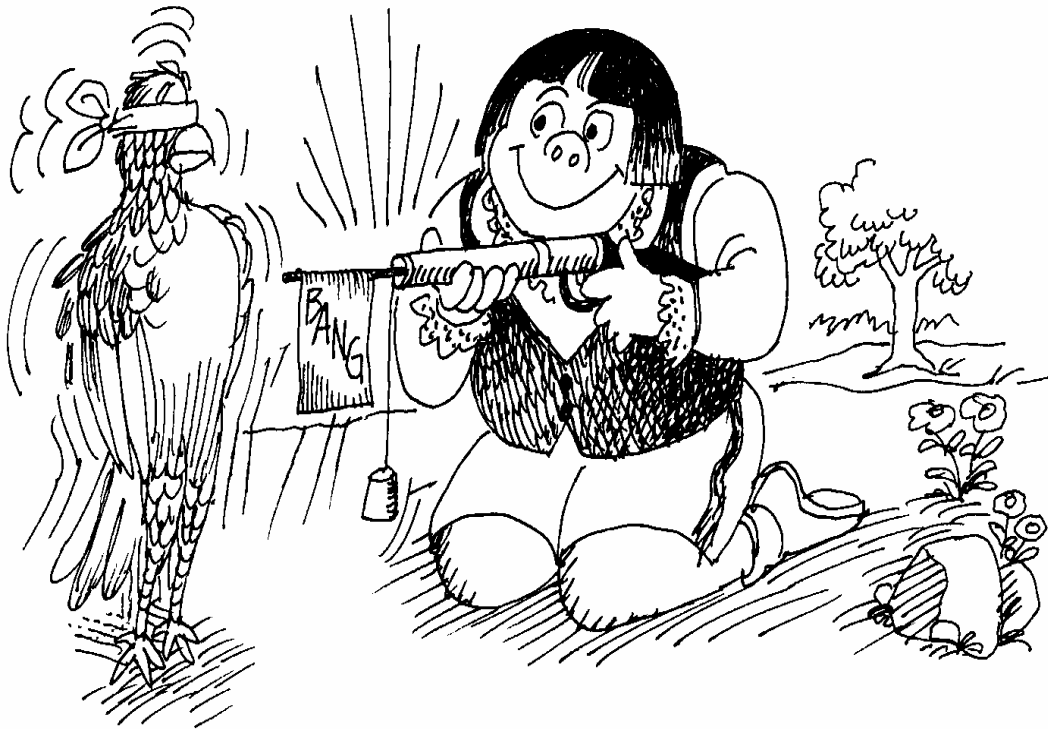

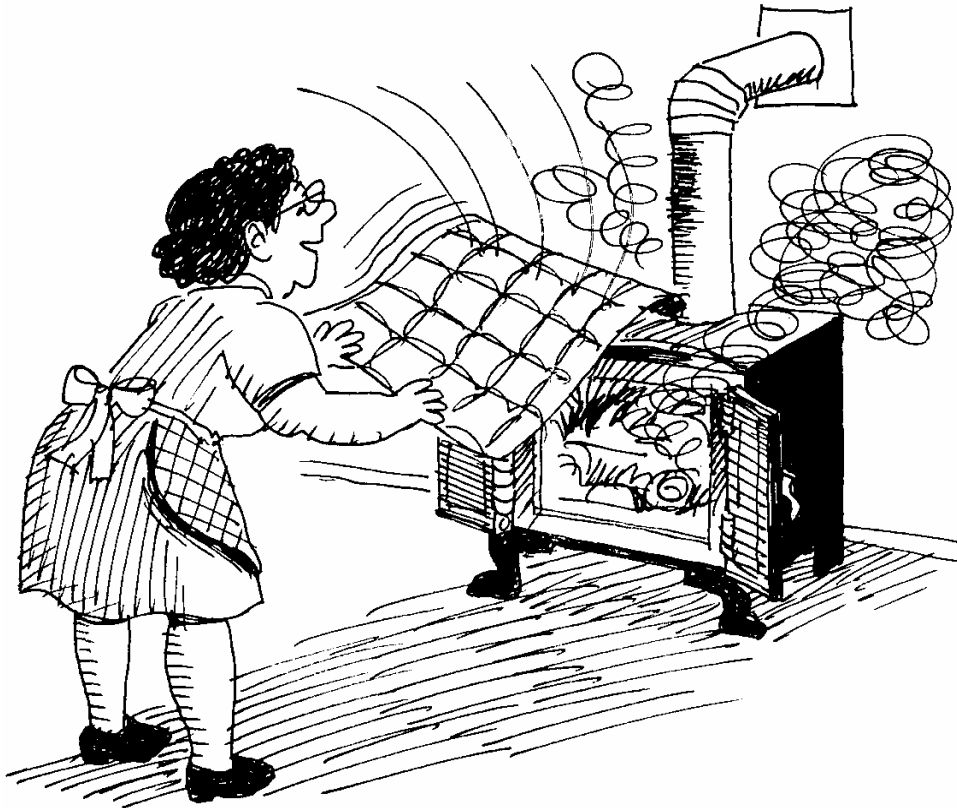

(kwel) v.

to extinguish; to put down
or suppress by force

 - ❑ The National Guard was sent in to try to **QUELL** the rioting crowd.

QUIETUDE

(KWIE ih tude) *n.*

calm; tranquility; peacefulness

who sought **QUIETUDE.**”*

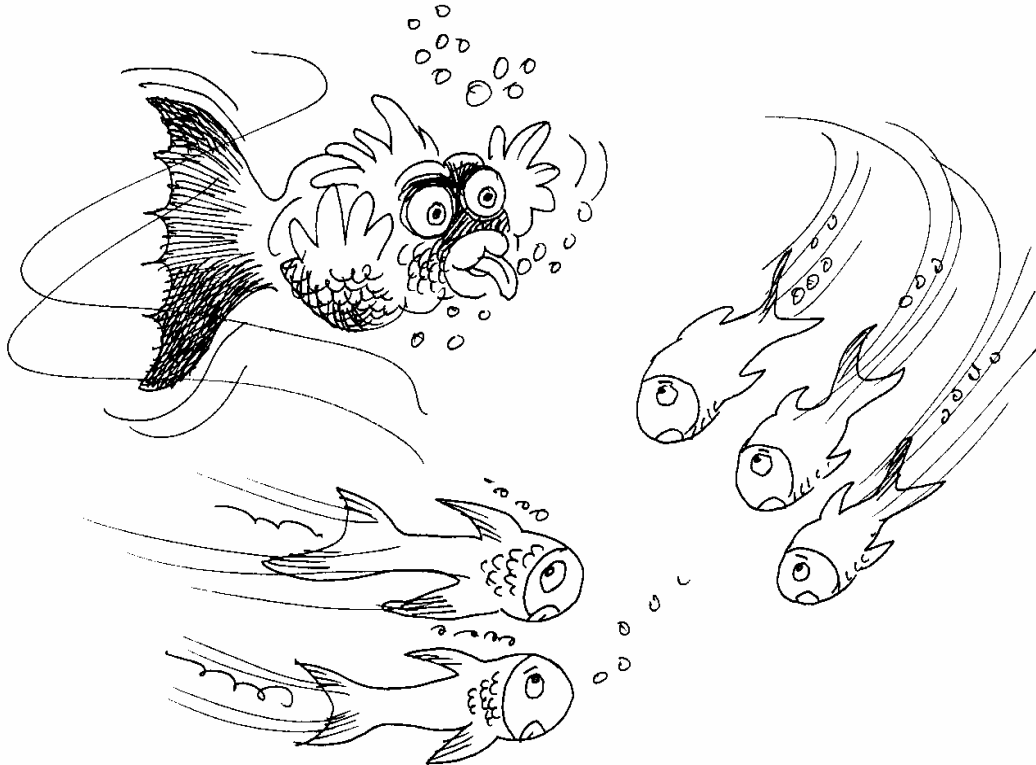

RAFFISH

(RAF ish) *adj.*

cheaply vulgar in appearance
or nature; tawdry; disreputable

“A RAFFISH FISH”

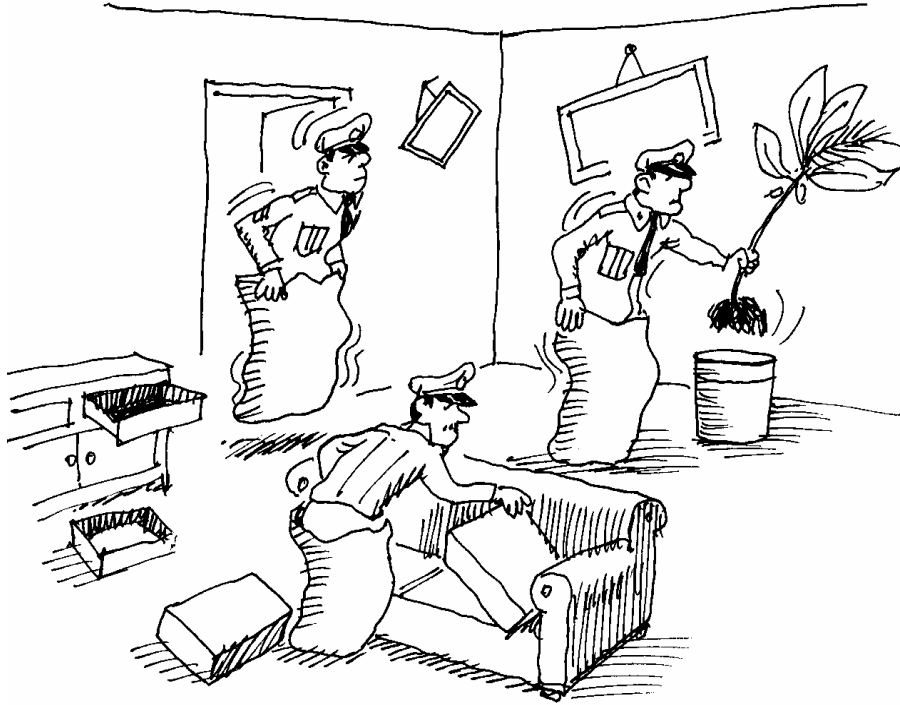

RANSACK

(RAN sak) v.

to search thoroughly; pillage

 - ❑ The thieves not only broke in, but they also **RANSACKED** the office looking for valuables.

REIGN

(rayn) *n.*

the exercise or possession
of supreme power

*“Frogs **REIGN** in the **RAIN**.”*

- Queen Elizabeth has **REIGNED** over England since the 1950s.
 - Many believe the king’s **REIGN** was strikingly enlightened.
 - The new winner of the Miss America pageant began her **REIGN** by taking the crown of last year’s winner.

REPLETE

(rih PLEET) *adj.*

full or supplied to the utmost; gorged

Link: **PETE**



*“**PETE** was **REPLETE** with supplies for his camping trip.”*

- ❑ We ordered our pizza with “the works”; it was **REPLETE** with sausage, ham, pepperoni, olives, onions, and anchovies.
 - ❑ Craig was well prepared for his fishing trip; his **REPLETE** tackle box had every kind of lure.
