


- □ The study of poetry often helps students to examine their own **PSYCHE**.

Link: PURR BLIND




"The **PURBLIND** cat **PURRED** as it was led by its seeing-eye mouse."


"A QUAFFING GIRAFFE"

QUAIL

(kwayl) *v.* to shrink with fear; to cower; to lose heart and courage

QUELL

(kwel) *v.* to extinguish; to put down or suppress by force

"Grandma QUELLED the fire with a QUILT."

- The mother attempted to QUELL the infant's cries by singing a lullaby.
- □ The National Guard was sent in to try to **QUELL** the rioting crowd.
- A mob stabbed Caesar in an attempt to QUELL his power.

QUIETUDE

(KWIE ih tude) n.

calm; tranquility; peacefulness

Link: QUIET DUDE



"Dad was a **QUIET DUDE** who sought **QUIETUDE**."

- Gene and Chris chose their property for the air of QUIETUDE and peace that pervaded the area.
- After the long illness, he had finally found QUIETUDE in death.
- □ The **QUIETUDE** of the substitute teacher took the whole class by surprise.

RAFFISH

(RAF ish) *adj.* cheaply vulgar in appearance or nature; tawdry; disreputable

"A RAFFISH FISH"


- The RAFFISH character had been seen at the scene of the murder and was taken in for questioning.

RANSACK

(RAN sak) v.

to search thoroughly; pillage

 RANSACKED the office looking for valuables.

REIGN

(rayn) *n.* the exercise or possession of supreme power

"Frogs **REIGN** in the **RAIN**."

- Queen Elizabeth has **REIGNED** over England since the 1950s.
- Many believe the king's **REIGN** was strikingly enlightened.
- □ The new winner of the Miss America pageant began her **REIGN** by taking the crown of last year's winner.

REPLETE

(rih PLEET) *adj.* full or supplied to the utmost; gorged

Link: PETE



"PETE was REPLETE with supplies for his camping trip."

- □ We ordered our pizza with "the works"; it was
 REPLETE with sausage, ham, pepperoni, olives, onions, and anchovies.
- Craig was well prepared for his fishing trip; his
 REPLETE tackle box had every kind of lure.
- □ The **REPLETE** buffet had many tantalizing dishes.
