an exact duplicate

- Identical twins may be called CLONES.

## COERCE

(koh URS) $v$.
to force someone by threatening or physically overpowering him

"COERCING a HORSE"

- The burglar's confession was COERCED by the police.
- Elizabeth was COERCED by her sister to take another cookie from the jar.
- It was evident from the video tape that the hostage was COERCED to lie about the status of her condition.


## CONFISCATE

(KON fi skayt) $v$.
to seize

"The CON'S CAKE was CONFISCATED."

- The teacher CONFISCATED Billy's gum.
- The police raided the suspect's apartment while CONFISCATING all his illegal drugs.
- The Internal Revenue Service threatened to CONFISCATE the accountant's files if he didn't pay his delinquent taxes.


## CONTINUUM

(kun TIN yoo um) $n$.
a continuous whole without clear division into parts

## Link: CONTINUE


"A beam of light is a CONTINUUM which CONTINUES from its source."

- A spectrum of light is a CONTINUUM in which each color blends with its neighbors.
- At the carnival, a CONTINUUM of weaving dances moved in a seemingly endless chain.
- Albert Einstein believed that space and time are not distinct dimensions, but a CONTINUUM, which he called the Theory of Relativity.


## CONUNDRUM

(kuh NUN drum) $n$.
a dilemma; any problem or puzzle

- Justin's CONUNDRUM after high school was whether he should go find a job or go to college first.

## COPIOUS

(KOH pee us) adj. abundant; plentiful

"A COPIOUS CUP of coffee"
