
"Secret agents COVERTLY COVER their true identities."


- Jim and his **CRONIES** go to the football games on Friday nights.




"A CRYPTIC note in LIPSTICK"

# **CURSORY**

(KUR suh ree) *adj.* rapid and superficial; performed with haste and scant attention to detail

Link: CURSE




"A **CURSORY** glance by the prince told him Cinderella's foot had been **CURSED**."


